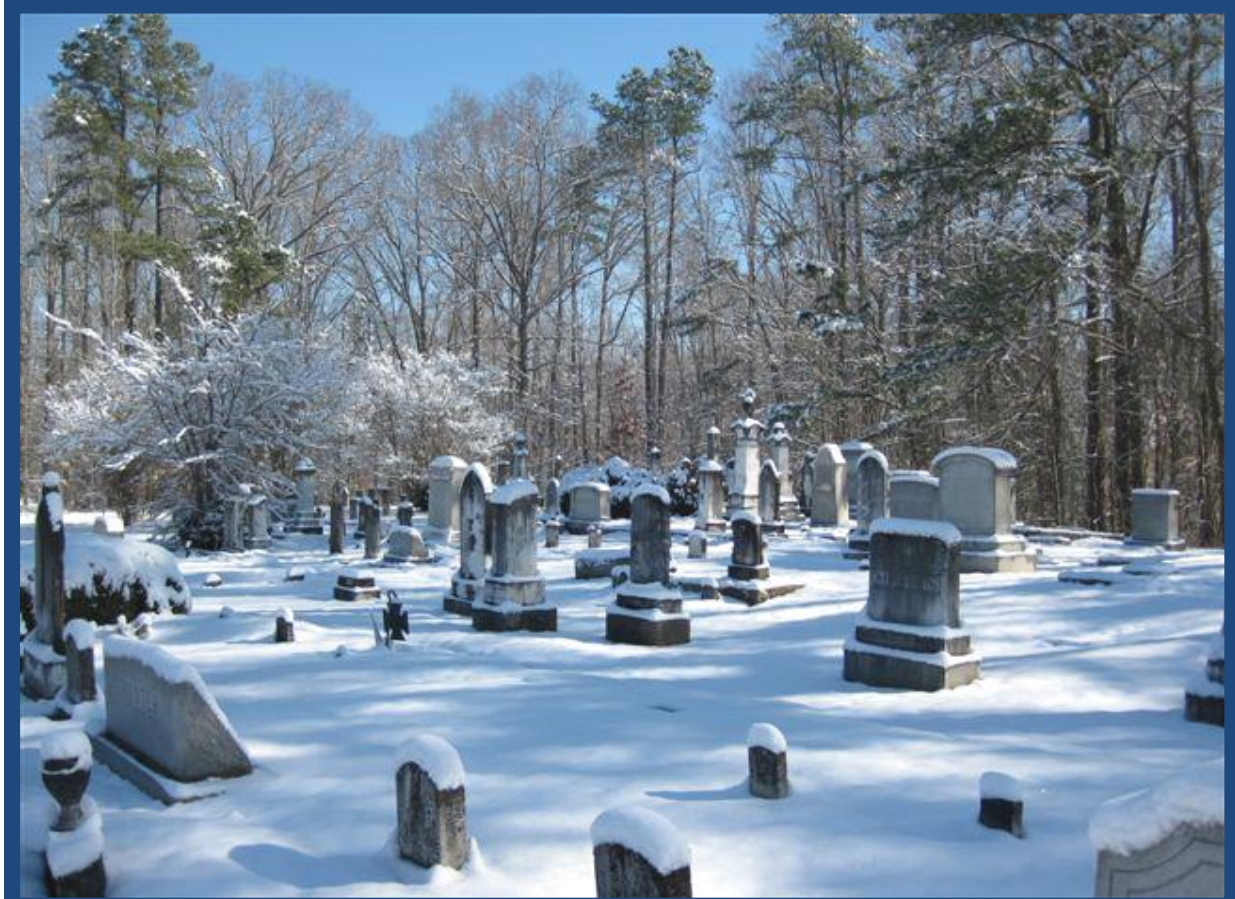

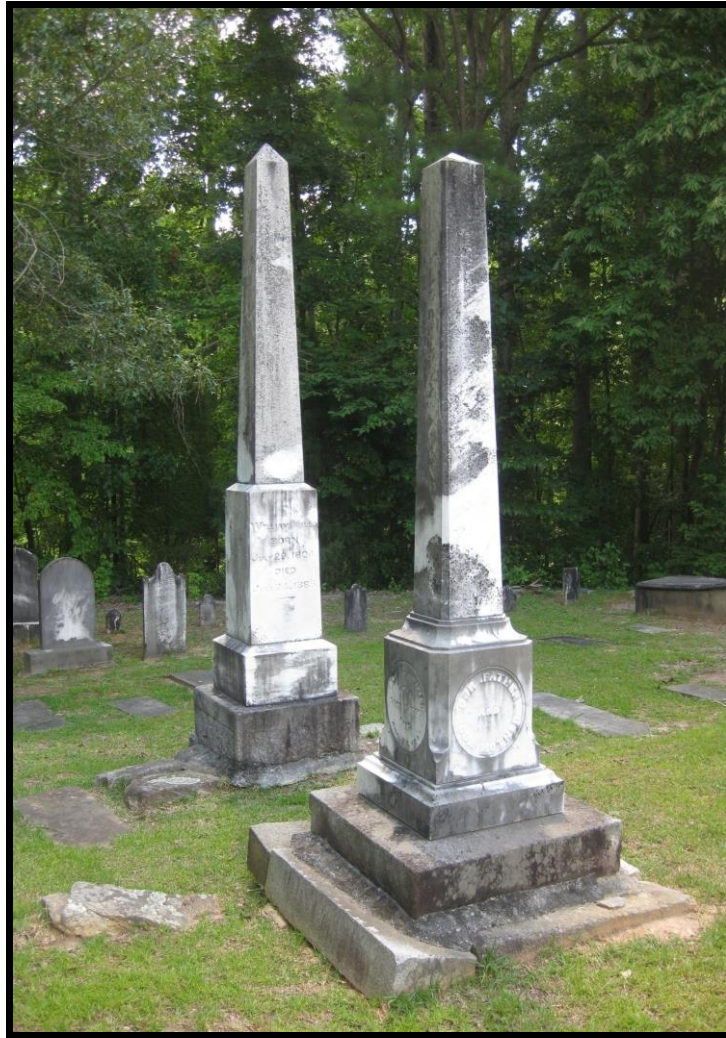

History of the Ora Church and Community

The Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church as we know it today comes to us across a lengthy history of service in two lands, the British Isles and North America. Its roots are traced to the Reformation, particularly the work of John Calvin and John Knox in Scotland when the Scottish Church became the official Church of Scotland in 1560 A.D. When the church and state become too closely allied, controversy and bitter strife over control became a way of life for church and state.

Things improved somewhat under King William III in 1688 as he reorganized the Church of Scotland into the Established Presbyterian Church of Scotland. In spite of the improvement, however, a great number of problems still existed, and in 1733 a pastor by the name of Ebenezer Erskine led a group of Christians in forming a separate Associate Presbytery (from thence comes the first part of our name). Ten years later, another group of Christians, who for years had suffered problems with the established church, organized themselves into the Reformed Presbytery.

Both churches spread to Northern Ireland as the Scots were forced to emigrate and both came to America with those "Scots-Irish" folks in search of religious freedom. Most of the earlier Presbyterians in America came in the early 1700's from Ulster, in the northern part of Ireland. The immigrants came to the Pennsylvania area at first, and it was there that both the Associate and the Reformed Presbyteries of Pennsylvania were organized in the 1750-1770 time period. Many settlers came from Pennsylvania and Virginia to the Laurens area in the 1760's and others came directly from Antrim County just before the Revolution. The graves of many of the descendants of these immigrants are found in this cemetery.

The Bounty Act of South Carolina

In order to help settle unoccupied lands the General Assembly of the Colony of South Carolina provided financial aid to encourage the immigration of poor Protestants from Europe. As early as 1730, "poor Protestants" were given land if they settled it. The grantees were required to clear and cultivate the land at the rate of at least 3 acres per year for each 100 acres of land granted. After two years, the land owner was required to pay 4 shillings per 100 acres quit rent (essentially land taxes). The amount of land granted was 100 acres for the head of the household and 50 acres for each dependent (wife and children under 15). Although the land was free there were significant fees to be paid for surveys and other legal matters. However, the Governor could and often did waive or otherwise pay these fees for poor immigrants.

In 1752, the act was amended to provide money for tools and provisions. In 1761 the bounty was changed to provide money to defray the costs of passage from Europe. To receive these benefits, immigrants were required to have certificates to show that they were of that religion and of good character.

"Warrants of Survey for their Lands" were issued on petition of the immigrants as authorized under the Act. Encouraged by the Act, large numbers of these protestant immigrants, many otherwise destitute, came to South Carolina, mostly from Europe, but also from other Colonies in America.

Many of the Scotch-Irish took advantage of the bounty and were settled in this area. The first white settler in the area of present day Ora was Michael McGuire, a Scotsman, who settled on a tract of 200 acres in 1766. Prior to that time, Indians inhabited the area.

The manners and dress of these first settlers must have been quite primitive. Their dress was as follows: huntingshirt, leggings, and moccasins, adorned with buckles and beads. The hair was clubbed and tied up in a little deerskin or silk bag. The women's dress was long-eared caps, Virginia bonnets, short gowns, long gowns, stays, stomachers, quilted petticoats, high wooden heels. Trade was carried on in skins and furs. Deer and beaver skins were a lawful tender in payment of debts.

On October 18, 1772, the James and Mary sailed into Charleston harbor, having spent the last 54 days at sea. The James and Mary was a three masted sailing ship called a snow, and was captained by John Workman. They had departed from Larne, Ireland on August 25 with 32 families and 48 single persons on board — a total of 180 passengers. The passengers were all Scots-Irish immigrants who were coming to South Carolina to accept the free land being offered by the Province and to escape the poverty and hard times that were in Northern Ireland. Of the 180 passengers that left Larne, only 175 arrived in Charleston, five children having died during the passage.

Among those aboard the ship James and Mary was **John McClintock** (grave # 1716), a Scotch-Irish Presbyterian, born about 1728 in Ireland, who left from County Antrim, Ireland, from the Port of Larne with his wife, Margaret Simpson and five children: James, Margaret, Martha, Mary and John- familiar names on the tombstones in the cemetery. After a seven week passage, they landed in Charles-town, SC, on Oct 18, 1772. Because of smallpox, the entire ship was quarantined for another seven weeks.

It was the custom, if the passengers were satisfied with the voyage, to write a letter for publication expressing their satisfaction. The following was published in the *Belfast News Letter* on Tuesday, 22 December 1772.

'To the Printers of the Belfast News Letter.

I desire you will insert and continue three times in your Paper, the inclosed Letter, which I received from South Carolina.

P. S. My Friend in Charlestown advises me, that they have a great Crop of Rice, but want Ships to carry it to Market.

Charles-Town, Oct. 21 1772

To Mr. JAMES M^cVICKAR, Merchant in Larne.

Sir

THESE will inform you, that we arrived here all well and in good spirits the 18th instant (five Children excepted who died in the Passage) after a pleasant and agreeable Passage of seven weeks and one day. — Pleasant with respect to Weather, and agreeable with regard to the Concord and Harmony that subsisted among us all: And, to confirm what we have heard you assert, before we left Ireland, we must say, that we had more than a sufficiency of all kinds of Provisions, and good in their kind: And to speak of Captain Workman, as he justly deserves, we must say with the greatest Truth (and likewise with the greatest Thanks and Gratitude to him) that he treated us all with the greatest Tenderness and Humanity: and seemed even desirous of obliging any one, whom it might be in his Power to serve. If you think proper, we would be desirous you should cause these Things to be inserted in the public News Letter, being sensible they will afford our Friends and Acquaintances great Satisfaction; and we hope they may be of some Use to you and Captain Workman, if you resolve to trade any more in the Passenger Way. Now, in Confirmation of these Things, We Subscribe ourselves as follows:

We are, Sir, your Most humble Servants,

Revd. Robert McClintock, John Peddan, Joseph Lowry, Timothy McClintock, Nathan Brown, Samuel Kerr, James Peddan, Alex. Brown, John Brown, Thomas Madill, Wm. Simpson, John McClintock, John Dicky, James Hood, John Montgomery, John Snoddy, John Caldwell, Robt. Hadden, Wm. Boyd, Robert Machesney, Wm. Eashler, Samuel Miller, Charles Dunlop, Thos. Makee, James Stinson, William Anderson, John Thompson, Hugh Loggan, Peter Willey, David Thompson, Hugh Mansead, Robt. Wilson, Robt. Ross, John Parker, James Young, Robt. Neile."

P. S. We had Sermon every Sabbath, which was great Satisfaction to us. We omitted to let you know, that the Mate, Mr. Bole, as also the common Hands, behaved with great Care and Benevolence towards us."

On Jan. 4, 1773, John McClintock received a land grant in the Milton section and later the same year moved his family to the Scuffletown section on Warrior Creek near the present location of Ora. He died in 1796 and his grave is the oldest marked grave in the cemetery (grave #1716).

John Hunter, Sr. and his wife, Margaret Bryson Hunter, natives of County Antrim, Ireland, emigrated some years previous to the Revolutionary War, to the lower edge of Laurens County. Research says that they probably arrived in America between 1765 and 1770. It is assumed he entered America through Philadelphia and pushed southward until he arrived at his destination in SC in 1771 and took advantage of the land grant opportunity. In 1790 his son, John II (grave # 1811), who was 24 years old, had married and settled upon lands of his own in Scuffletown (Ora) some 20 miles northward, on the tract of land formerly belonging to Michael McGuire mentioned earlier. It has been the home site of successive generations of Hunters for over 200 years.

By 1820 the settlement was referred to as ‘Scuffletown’ because of the incessant ‘scuffling’ around the store and post office, (the Irish word for wrestle was scuffle) and from this community the Township of Scuffletown took its name. When the Scotch-Irish Presbyterians came, by sail, from County Antrim, Ireland, they had no rooms for means of entertainment but they were pleasure loving Scots. After the crops were ‘laid by’, the menfolk frequently engaged in such athletic competitions as scuffling, wrestling, jumping, running, pitching dollars, throwing ‘long-bullets’ and nine pens. Their families gathered for picnics and enjoyed fiddling and dancing and playing such games as blind man’s bluff, rimming the thimble, grinding the bottle and dropping the glove.

It was a heady time in the new world, and all the "old alliances" were being called into question. The new America was emerging and at the same time our forefathers were seeking to create a new church as well. Formal union talks between the "Associates" and the "Reformed" began in 1777 and by 1782 the Associate Reformed Synod came to be in Philadelphia. This Synod included churches in Pennsylvania, New York, Ohio, North and South Carolina and Georgia.

Eight years later, the Associate Reformed Presbytery of the Carolinas and Georgia was formed in Abbeville County, S.C., followed some twenty years later (1803) by the division of the entire church into four Synods and one General Synod. The Synods were those of the Carolinas, Pennsylvania, New York and Scioto with the headquarters of the church in Philadelphia. In 1822 the Synod of the Carolinas was granted separate status, and by the end of the century was the sole remaining body of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church. The remaining "A.R.P.s" in the Southeast continued on as the denomination we have today.

There are now ten Presbyteries in North America. Ora belongs to Second Presbytery which includes Western South Carolina and Georgia.

ARP's stand firm on the tenets of Reformed theology as stated in the **Westminster Confession of Faith**. Our foundational doctrinal statements are found in **The Standards of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church**, which we hold to be "the system of doctrine which is built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ himself being the chief cornerstone" (Associate Reformed Synod, May 31, 1799).

Mission Statement of the ARP Church

1. The mission of the Church is a mission of witness and ministry. Christ called the people of the Church "witnesses." Paul saw God as giving gifts to equip the Church's people for the work of ministry.
2. All that the Church says and does is to be a witness to Jesus Christ, God's living Word, as He is spoken of in the Holy Scriptures, God's written Word. God has sent His Church into the world that the Church will present Jesus Christ through preaching, witnessing, teaching, sacrament, worship and both individual and corporate Christian living and action. All of the Church's people in every phase of their living are to be God's ministers to the world by being servants of His Son, the King of the Church.
3. God the Father has given the Holy Spirit through Christ to the world to reveal and to make the ministry of the Church effective.

3. Unity with other believers in Christ.
4. Total Stewardship of life - time, talents, and money - including tithing through the local church.

8. Evaluating and changing church structures and priorities in order to meet the challenges of the future while preserving the best of the past.

Ora ARP Church

This congregation, located on Highway 221 North in Laurens County, is among the oldest in the Synod. It was originally known as Madole's Old Field, and later as Old Field, named for the man who donated land for the church. He later gave several acres of land surrounding the church for the cemetery, which is still in use.

The oldest records in the possession of the Elders date back to 1841. When the Associate Reformed Presbytery of the Carolinas and Georgia was organized at Long Cane (near Greenwood), S. C., on February 24, 1790, what is now the Ora Church was reported as a vacancy, proving the existence of a congregation at this time. It is unknown how long the church may have existed prior to this date. The Presbytery was organized with four ministers and forty-four churches, one of which was Ora (then called Warrior Creek); though there was no settled pastor at the time. In 1812, Rev. John Renwick, Jr., who was pastor of a church in Newberry County, was called to become the first pastor of the Ora Church.

By 1809 the name of the church was changed to Warrior Creek, the name of a stream about two miles northwest of the church. In 1836 the name was changed to Bethel. In 1885 a surveyor for the railroad, Robert Tyler MacDonald, suggested the name "Ora" for the depot to be located in the community in honor of Ora Hunter, one of the pretty young ladies of the community he had fallen in love with. He later married her and she is buried in the cemetery. Descendents of the family still live in the community today. The church became known as Ora and in 1966, the Session asked Presbytery to change the name officially to Ora ARP, since it was already called that by common practice.

Between 1836 and 1851 there began to be an element in the church wishing to make changes in ordinances of the church. This eventually led to withdrawal of some members and the organization of the Presbyterian (Southern) Church. A new building was built and owned jointly by the two congregations, the A.R.P.'s using it three Sabbaths a month and the Presbyterians one Sabbath. This continued until the A.R.P.'s built their own building, which is the present one. This weakened the original church, yet the congregation, made up of both whites and blacks, was rather large. After the Civil War, many blacks remained in the church until their deaths, but others left when they were freed. The slave cemetery adjoins the community cemetery in the woods but is no longer recognizable.

There have been four buildings used by this congregation. The first two were simple log houses located near the present site. They had no heat and rough plank seats with no backs and with pole legs. The present building was constructed in 1896 with lumber cut and sawed from land

owned by the congregation. The session house stood near the church and for many years was used as the community schoolhouse and later as a community building for social events.

In April, 1953, the Presbyterian (Southern) Church, located just a few yards from the A.R.P. Church, decided to disband, since there were so few members and they had been without a pastor for some time. At this time, 19 communicants and two baptized children were received by transfer from their Presbytery. Their church property became a part of the A.R.P. Church. The church building was later dismantled. The Gray Court-Owings Historical Society obtained the building and reconstructed it in a pioneer homestead, called The Culbertson Back Country Settlement, located in Gray Court, SC.



Today you will find the photographs of pastors of the church from 1836 to present and 7 pictures of former pastors of the Old Fields Presbyterian Church from 1895 to 1953 in the assembly room in the Bethel Building. As you look over this group you come to realize that

Ora has been greatly blessed with leaders that are dedicated men of God. ARP's were willing to make great sacrifices for the sake of education. They demanded an educated ministry even though this meant that they were to lose large numbers to denominations requiring a less exacting standard. There simply were not enough Presbyterian preachers to go around.

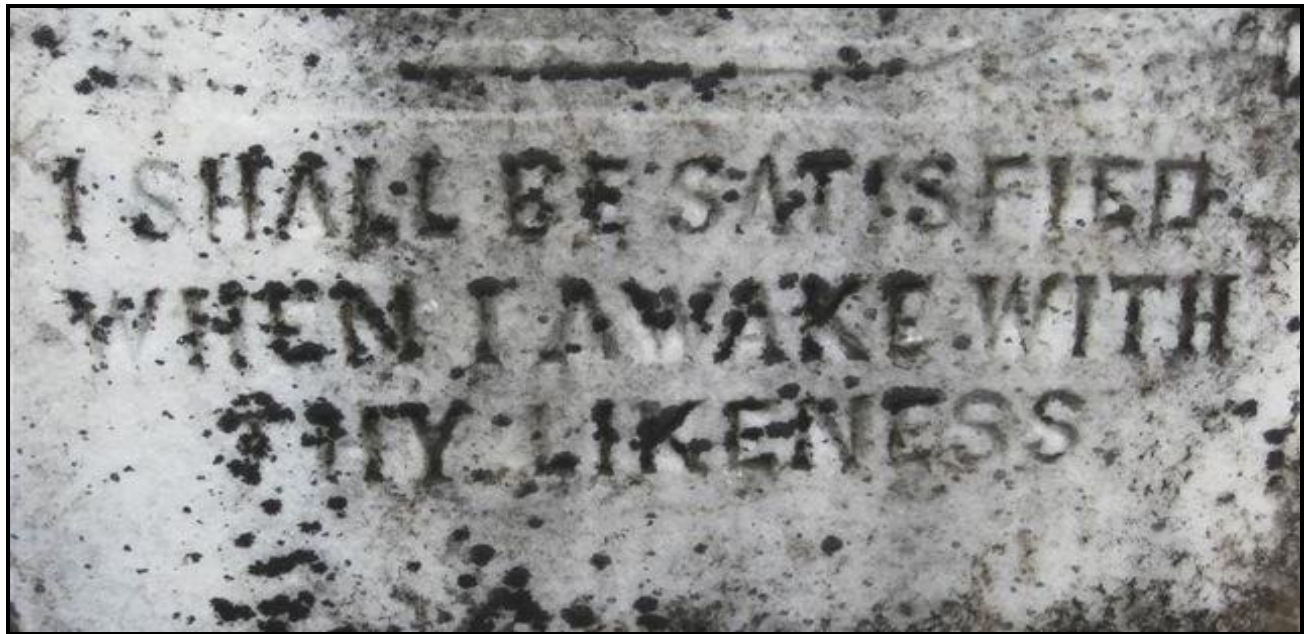

ORA ARP Church in 2010

The church today has a membership of 114 with an active Sunday School with classes from nursery through adult. We have Prayer Meeting and youth groups. The church also has two circles of the Women's Ministries for a total membership of 19. The Ora Church also has a Men's Club, which has a prayer breakfast each quarter.

The Ora Church is active in Home Missions and in Foreign Missions, helping support Ali & Tara Mitchell, Jim & Galita Coad, Jane Blakely Jennings (who was raised in Ora), and Robert and Rachel Turner. Rob served as a pastor at the church until he was called to the mission field in Turkey. The youth participates in an Appalachia Mission trip annually. Other activities include: Vacation Bible School, Fall Festival, Youth Activities, Community Health Festival, Homecoming, and an Active Choir.

Renovations were done in 2009 attempting to preserve the old part of the church and return it to its original structure and maintain its historical significance. Paneling, which had been added to the two rooms at the front of the church, was removed and the old beaded board walls were

restored and painted. The lowered ceiling was raised to its original height and new light fixtures were added. The original pine floors were refinished and new carpet runners were installed in the sanctuary. Other changes were made to the bathrooms throughout the church. A covered picnic shelter was built behind the church next to the playground.

In 2009, the Session at ORA ARP Church suggested that an updated cemetery list be compiled. I was already working on this project, having secured a copy of the cemetery map from Mr. Maxcy Hunter, a cemetery trustee. I also used a book borrowed from Reverend William Blakely entitled Burying Grounds, Graveyards and Cemeteries, Laurens, SC, Volume 5, 2007. Although the listings in this book were not in any kind of order, I was able to use the information from their research to put some names and dates on some of the graves which were unmarked or no longer readable. Unfortunately there are a great many graves identified only by fieldstones and it is probable that there are other graves that are unmarked.

Interesting Cemetery Facts

- According to some members, there are some slave graves in the woods behind the cemetery, which are not marked and today are unidentifiable.
- The earliest readable marker in the cemetery is John McClintock (#1716) who died on August 9, 1796. He was born in Antrim County, Ireland.
- John Sloan (#1505) was the oldest person buried here living 113 years, 3 months and 12 days.
- Reverend Haddon (# 615), who served as pastor of Bethel (Ora), Head Springs & Providence ARP Churches for nearly 47 years, is buried here.
- The Community of Ora was named after Ora Hunter MacDonald (# 321) in 1885 by the railroad surveyor, Robert Tyler MacDonald.
- There are 447 grave sites on the old side and 364 on the new side, for a total of 811.
- At the time of time of this publication there are approximately 491 occupied graves, 130 reserved sites, and 190 empty sites.

There are a number of men buried here who served our country. Some of them are indicated on their markers and listed below:

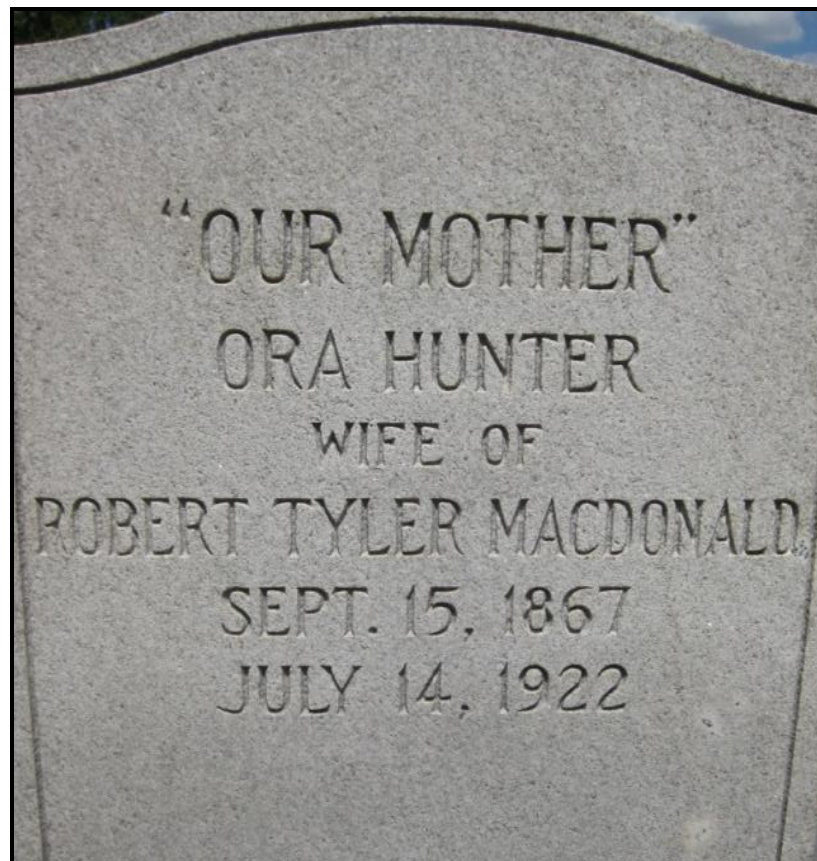

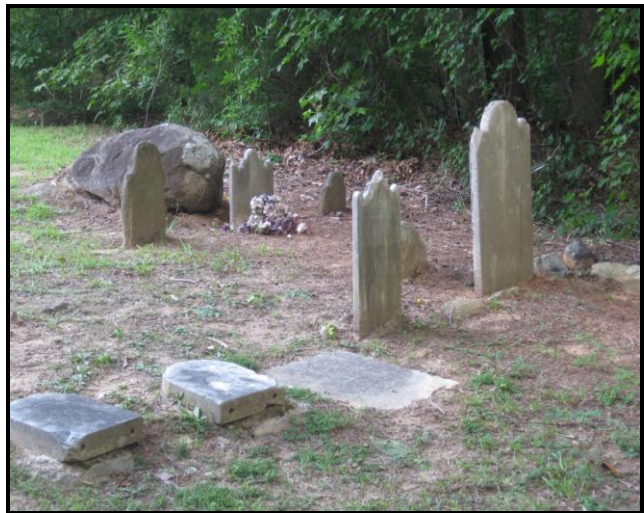

There are two listings of all the known names of the people interred here. The first one is an alphabetical listing and the second is a listing in order by rows. The older side is listed first and then the newer side on the other side of the road. The grave sites on the older side are numbered in order beginning at the south end of the cemetery next to the road and working to the north end in rows back toward the tree line. Some portions of the rows are a bit offset but I hope it will still be easy to follow with a map. Some inscriptions are included although many are unreadable.

The new side is numbered in the opposite direction, according to the official cemetery map. They run from east to west, beginning at the south end. These sites have no above ground markers. Reserved plots are listed also. All other plots are still available.

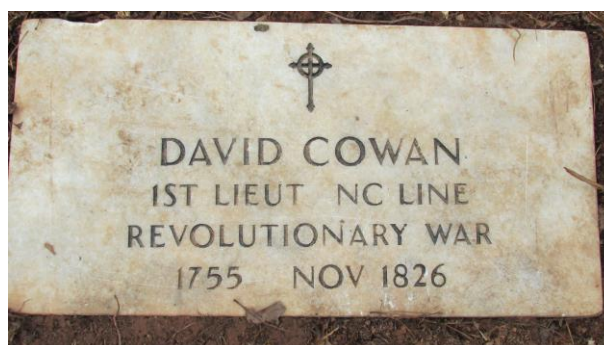
Slave Cemetery
